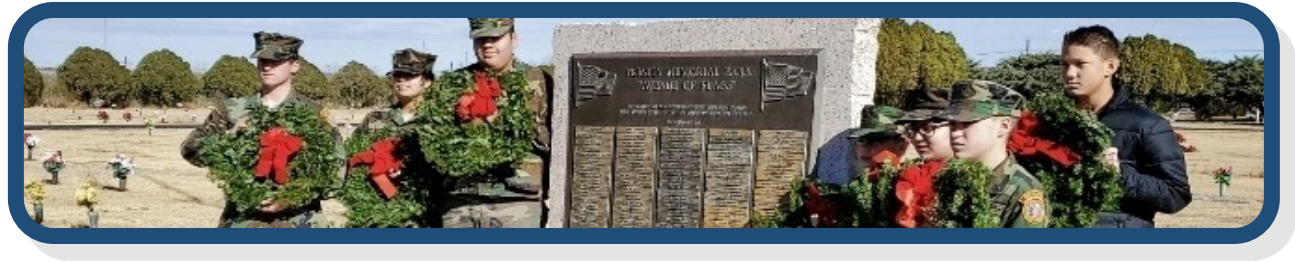

WAA Mission

Our yearlong mission to **Remember, Honor, Teach** is carried out, in part, by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery, veterans' cemeteries, and other locations in all 50 states and beyond. Although people may be most familiar with National Wreaths Across America Day, the organization's mission lasts far beyond one day in December.



★ “Remember” the fallen.

When a volunteer places a wreath on a servicemember's grave on National Wreaths Across America Day, we encourage them to speak that person's name aloud, thank them for their service and sacrifice, and reflect on their life along with our wreath-laying ceremonies. WAA also holds special memorial ceremonies at all cemeteries throughout the country.

On the tip-lands in Maine, where the tips of balsam fir trees are harvested to become veterans' wreaths, replica dog tags representing thousands of veterans create a living memorial of fallen veterans giving back to other fallen veterans.

WAA History

- ★ **1992:** The first wreaths (5,000) were donated, and a tradition started by Maine wreath-maker Morrill Worcester, owner of Worcester Wreath Co., as a gift of thanks.
- ★ **2005:** An iconic photo of wreaths in the snow became a viral sensation.
- ★ **2007:** Wreaths Across America formed as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit.
- ★ **Since 2008:** Congress annually proclaims a Saturday in December as National Wreaths Across America Day. *It will be held this year on Saturday, December 16, 2023.*
- ★ **2012:** Millionth wreath placed at Arlington National Cemetery.
- ★ **2014:** Every headstone at Arlington National Cemetery received a wreath for the first time.
- ★ **2016:** 25th year that veterans' wreaths are placed at Arlington National Cemetery.
- ★ **2018:** Mission advances overseas with the first placement of 9,387 veterans' wreaths at Normandy-American Cemetery in France.
- ★ **2021:** Marked the 30th year veterans' wreaths are placed at Arlington National Cemetery.
- ★ **2022:** 2.7 million wreaths are placed at over 3,700 locations nationwide and abroad.

2022 Recap and 2023 Theme

2022 Recap

WAA's annual pilgrimage from Harrington, Maine, to Arlington National Cemetery has become known as the world's largest veterans' parade. Along the way, it stops at schools, monuments, veterans' homes, and communities to remind people how important it is to remember, honor and teach.

- ★ 2.7 million veterans' wreaths are placed nationwide at 3,702 locations.
- ★ More than two million volunteers participated in National Wreaths Across America Day. More than a third of the volunteers were children.
- ★ At Arlington National Cemetery specifically, the Wreaths Across America program saw sixty-six tractor trailers deliver over 250,000 sponsored veterans' wreaths that nearly 38,000 volunteers placed.
- ★ In total, 571 truckloads of wreaths were delivered nationwide by hundreds of volunteer professional truck drivers representing 390 carriers who donated their equipment and fuel to honor our veterans on National Wreaths Across America Day.



2023 Theme: Serve and Succeed

The inspiration for this year's theme came while discussing the significance of 2022's theme, "Find a Way to Serve," and the need to continue to stress the importance of service and the positive ways it can impact lives. Wreaths Across America focused 2023 on veterans and military families who have found success through their service and volunteers from across the country and the success that comes from serving their communities.

Each \$17 sponsorship supports WAA's yearlong program and places a live, balsam veteran's wreath on the headstone of an American hero as we endeavor to honor all veterans laid to rest on Saturday, December 16, 2023, as part of National Wreaths Across America Day.

★ Celebrating the Four Chaplains and Charles Walter David Jr

On February 3, 2023, Wreaths Across America honored the Four Chaplains and Charles Walter David Jr. as honorees in our Remembrance Tree Program.

On January 23, 1943, the **U.S.A.T. Dorchester** left New York harbor bound for Greenland, carrying over 900 officers, service members, and civilian workers. The ship was transiting the Labrador Sea when torpedoed by a German U-boat (U-233) on February 3, 1943. The ship sank, and 675 people on board lost their lives. Amidst the chaos to save 230 lives, four chaplains guided soldiers trapped below deck to escape hatches and gave away their life jackets to save others on that fateful day. When the chaplains had done all they could, they linked arms to pray and sing hymns as the **Dorchester** slipped beneath the waves.

As part of the rescue response to the sinking of the Dorchester, African American Coast Guardsman Charles Walter David Jr. jumped into icy Greenland waters from his rescue ship to save two men from drowning and continued to help rescue a total of 93 survivors from lifeboats. After his heroic acts, 54 days later, Charles Walter David Jr. succumbed to pneumonia stemming from those icy waters.

★ Celebrating the Quartermaster Corp of WWII

Assigned to logistics and service units; by 1944, almost all black soldiers were assigned to these units. They were responsible for building bridges, roads, and runways. They moved beans, bullets, fuel, and the fallen – their efforts were critical to the Allied success. They embodied the modern military saying, “Amateurs study tactics, professionals study logistics. The story of black quartermasters is crucial because it not only signifies the courage and bravery of these Americans but demonstrates their ingenuity and how their service led to success on the battlefield and when they came home.

★ **Remembering the 60th Anniversary of Flying Tiger Line Flight 739**

On March 16, 2023, Wreaths Across America honored the courageous crew of Flying Tiger Line Flight 739 at the only monument on earth dedicated in their honor on the tip lands in Maine.



Very little is known about what happened to Flying Tiger Line Flight 739, a military mission plane that went missing on March 16, 1962, with 93 U.S. Army Soldiers on board and 11 crew members. Due to the complexities surrounding the mission, the names of all those who have been lost have not yet been added to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. WAA unveiled a memorial to these brave men and women and their families on May 15, 2021.

The Wreaths Across America annual “Escort to Arlington” is what many people consider the country’s longest veterans’ parade. This 12-truck convoy begins at the organization’s headquarters in Columbia Falls, Maine, the week before Wreaths Across America Day.



As the convoy travels to Arlington National Cemetery to deliver veterans wreaths to our nation’s interred veterans, it is accompanied by Chevrolet vehicles, the Wreaths Across America Mobile Education Exhibit, local first responders, and supporters as they make their way down the East Coast.

★ Wreaths Across America Teach Curriculum

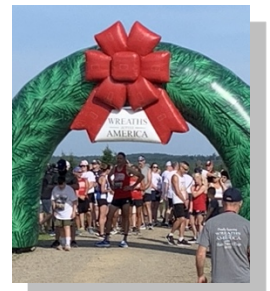
